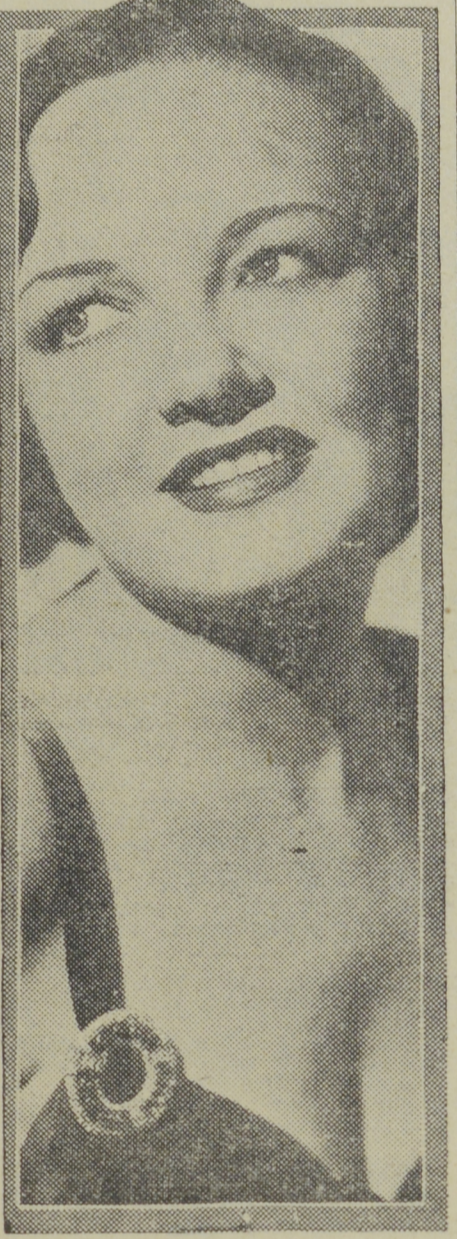

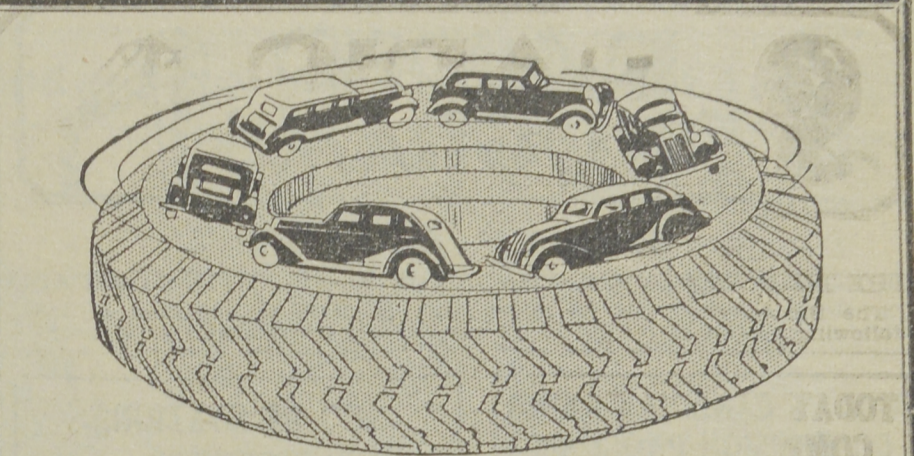
### Stooge For Cantor
