

Around the Maritimes

Non-resident hunters in New Brunswick last year numbered 715, compared with 289 in 1934.

Some 1,100,000 quarts of strawberries were gathered, commercially, in New Brunswick last year, being an increase of ten per cent. over 1934.

Legislation providing that horse-drawn vehicles must be illuminated either by lamp or reflector "after sunset and before sunrise" was considered by the Prince Edward Island Assembly in committee recently.

At a recent meeting of the Sackville Board of Trade executive a resolution was passed favoring Albert County as the site for a National Park. The president was asked to prepare a resolution to this effect to be sent to the Provincial Government.

The site or the time when work will commence on the new C.N.R. bridge between Fredericton and Devon will not be known for some time it was stated by H. T. Hazen, Montreal, chief engineer of the Atlantic Region of the C.N.R., who has been investigating the prospects of the new bridge.

Allegations of "excessiveness and discrimination" in the rate-chargings of the Western Nova Scotia Electric Company in the serving of electrical energy to the town of Yarmouth are made by the council of that centre in a citizen-supported petition filed with the Board of Public Utilities.

Twenty-three separate gold mining properties are being worked in Nova Scotia at present and nine gold crushing mills are operating. During 1935, 9,050 fine ounces of gold were produced, representing an increased value (over 1934) of \$230,000. The present year offers prospects of a doubling of the 1935 figure.

Building totals for March, 1936, were three times those of March, 1935, figures released at the Halifax City Engineer's office show. Ten new dwellings were commenced during March, and the total value of building work ap-

plied for was \$78,377 as against \$24,575 for the same month last year.

While there has been nothing yet to indicate what effect the early season will have on pasturage, some fears are held by agriculturists that frosts may follow shortly and do damage to the spring growth which the advanced season will bring out, resulting possibly in an ill effect, particularly on the apple crop.

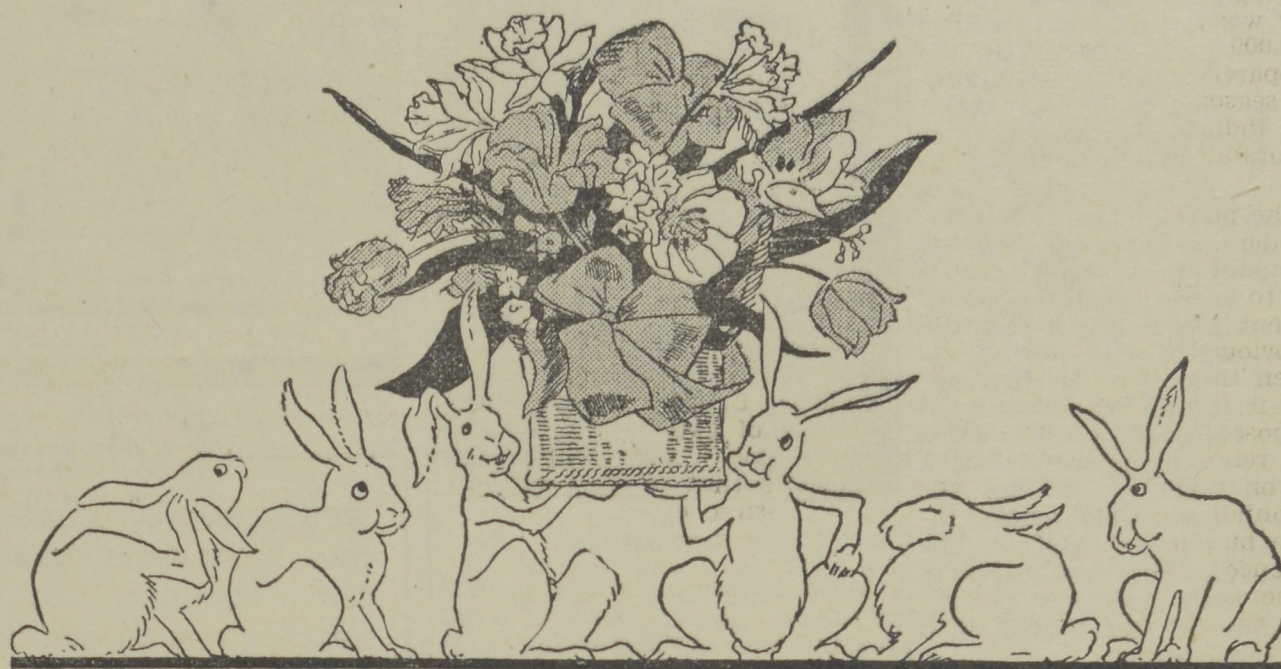
"Accidental death due to carbon monoxide gas poisoning" was the verdict brought in by a coroner's jury inquiring into the deaths of J. L. Roy and Miss Ethel Sanson, found dead in Roy's automobile, parked on the Salisbury Road last Thursday morning, where it apparently had stood since 9.00 o'clock the previous night.

Authorization for the construction of a transmission line from the North Devon sub-station across the Fredericton-Devon highway bridge through Fredericton to New Maryland, where it will connect with the commission's present line at Rusagornis, was given at a recent meeting of the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission, presided over by Hon. W. S. Anderson, chairman.

The New Brunswick Contractors, Ltd., have been awarded the contract for constructing a new four-storey building at the corner of Queen and Carleton Streets, in Fredericton. The price of the contract was said to be in the vicinity of \$29,000. The new building, which will be of brick, will take the place of the old Ryan property and is expected to be completed by September 1.

The death rate in P.E.I. from tuberculosis in 1935 was lowest in ten years, the annual report of the Department of Health, tabled in the Legislature by Hon. Mark R. MacGuigan showed. The T.B. death rate last year per 100,000 population was 71.9, a decrease of more than 25 per cent. compared with 1934. (Prince Edward Island's population is approximately 88,000.)

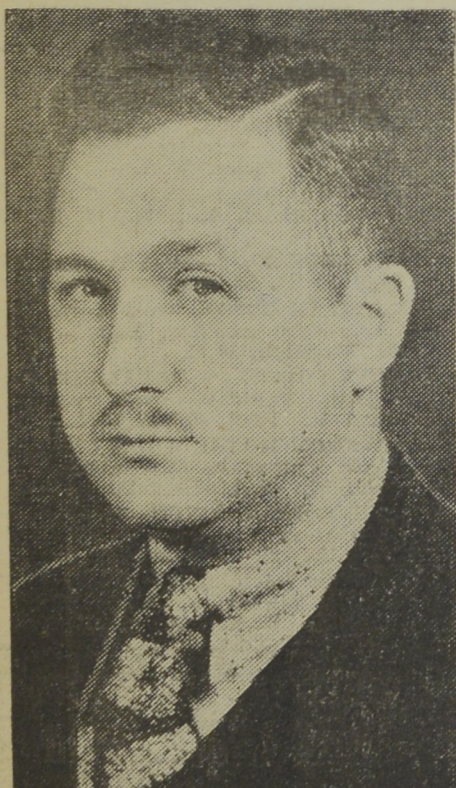
