

THE RIGHT KIND OF MEN

WHO ARE wanted as members of the Saint John City Council? Will we vote for candidates out of sympathy? Will we vote for some one because we think he needs a job? Or will we consider him from a civic standpoint and vote only for the candidates we believe have ability to see that civic government is carried on economically and efficiently?

Saint John is in a precarious situation and we need the best brains available at City Hall. No citizen can expect to pick up men trained in every phase of civic activity. No one can expect an elected representative of the citizens to draw up plans for engineering work, neither would it be expected that such a man could handle the internal affairs and details of the street, police or other department.

What the citizens should desire are men who will act as directors of the corporation, seeing to legislative matters and watching the different departments to stimulate efficiency everywhere.

In selecting representatives citizens should look to the qualifications of those offering their services. As some one has said, for good government we need men who are able; men who fear God and love the truth; men who hate covetousness; men who will face the facts, wanting to know things as they really are; men who will take part in the government for what they can put into it and not for what they can take out of it.

Dominion Loans Soon Available Here It Is Stated

Hope To Stimulate Building in All Parts of the Dominion.

The Dominion Housing Act will be working in Saint John in the near future, the Common Council was informed this week by a letter from W. M. Ryan, M.P. The act is designed to improve housing conditions and stimulate activity in the building trades. The Dominion will allow prospective house owners borrow up to 80 per cent. of the value of the dwelling and lot, at interest rates not to exceed five per cent. The borrower must supply 20 per cent. of the cost of the building.

Mr. Ryan said that he had been informed that the Central Trust Company and the Sun Life Assurance Company have agreed to work under the act.

Those contemplating making loans are supposed to make their applications to the loaning companies, who will pass the application along to the Dominion Department for consideration.

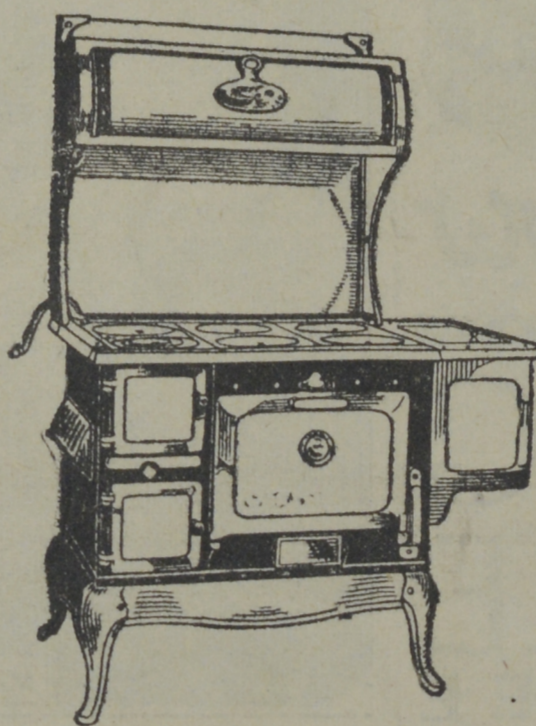

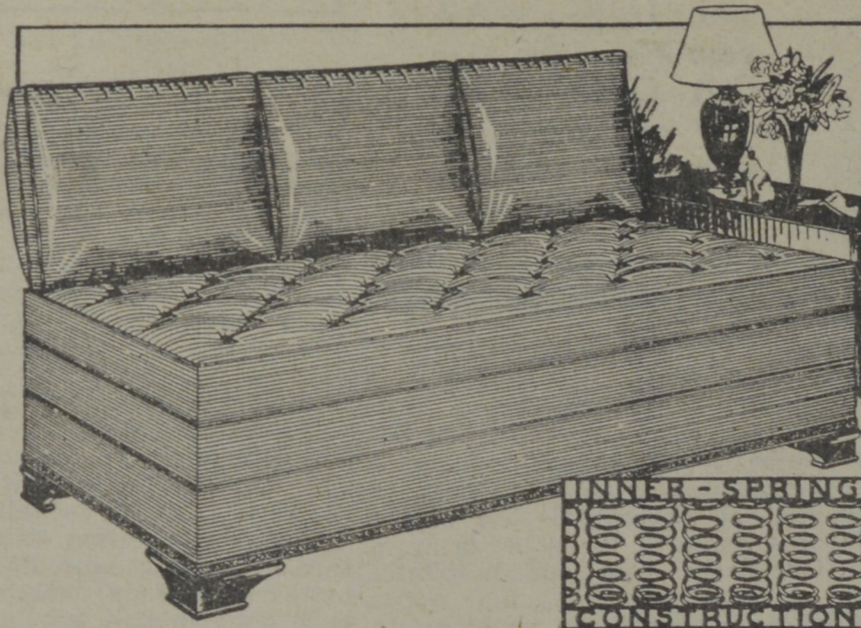

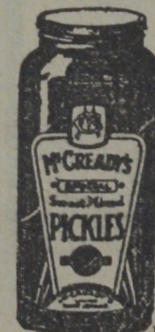
