

### Plea Made For The Younger Men Who Wish To Own Farm

W. W. V. Foster Tells Legislature How Some Problems May Be Solved.

Assistance for young men, some of them sons of farmers, who wish to establish themselves on farms of their own, was urged by W. W. V. Foster, member for Kings County, in his speech seconding the address in reply to the Speech from the Throne in the Legislature last Thursday. Mr. Foster said he had had inquiries from young men of the County of Kings regarding aid in this regard and on inquiry he had been informed that the present provincial machinery is inadequate for the purpose. He understood that there was a sum of upwards of \$500 000 standing to the credit of the Province with the Dominion Government for the number of farms taken over from the Province by the Soldier Settlement Board. He suggested that the Government make available some of this money for the purpose he mentioned under reasonable and
