Court Is Asked To Reinstate Members of Police Force

Saint John Case Goes To The Appeal Division For Settlement.

The Appeal Division of the Supreme Court of New Brunswick has been brought into Saint John civic affairs by the application for an order requiring Commissioner Walsh to show cause why an order absolute for a writ of mandamus should not be issued reinstating Matron Adams and Detective McBrien as members of the Saint John Police Force.

The application was made to the Court which convened in Saint John last Saturday and the rule was made returnable on Monday, March 30 at 10.30 in the morning. Service was ordered to be made on the commissioner of public safety, the City of Saint John and the acting chief of police.

The court was composed of Chief Justice Baxter, Mr. Justice Grimmer and Mr. Justice Harrison. H. Lester Smith, of Fredericton, registrar of the Supreme Court, also was present.

C. F. Inches, K.C., and A. B. Gilbert appeared in support of the motion. Mr. Gilbert read an affidavit sworn to by Mrs. Annie Adams, in which she stated she was appointed police matron in May, 1924, and has held that position continuously till the present time. The affidavit stated that on March 19, 1936, Chief Inspector Mc-Leese, acting chief of police, read to her a letter which he had received from the commissioner of public safety, instructing the acting chief to inform Mrs. Adams and Mr. Mc-Brien that they had been dismissed from the force, their dismissal to take effect at

THE PROPOSED changes in the civic form of government for Saint John City, as brought forward by the Civic Improvement League, have been endorsed by the Board of Trade, Retail Merchants' Associatios, various clubs and organizations, as well as citizens generally. The people have come to realize that under the present set-up there have been abuses, both in omission and commission, in the government and these have been detrimental to the well-being of the city.

In bringing forward the proposals for change, the one thought dominating the minds of the promoters of the movement has been to eliminate the bad, retain the good and to add those things necessary for the mutual good of the city and the citizens as a whole. The aim has been to make it possible for the taxpayers to choose from the highest type of citizens, men to conduct the business of the city in all its departments economically and efficiently.

Under the present commission act, a man to serve as commissioner must either be out of work, looking for a job, or else he must give up his own business to accept office. Few men can afford to give up an occupation or business in order to serve the city, no matter how interested he may be. Under the new system which is being advocated, a citizen is not asked to give up his business but is invited to devote a part of his time to assist in carrying on the affairs of the city, as directors of large businesses now do, at a nominal salary or director's fee. Under such a system it will be possible to have the best business brains to direct civic affairs. Instead of the man seeking the job the job will be seeking the man.
