The neurotic type occurs in certain individuals who have a hyper-sensitive stomach mucosa. They frequently have hiccough which lasts sometimes for days or weeks.

Hiccough is occasionally epidemic, apparently due to the action of a germ, similar to the germ of sleeping sickness, which affects the nerve centres of the respiratory region.


Remedies for hiccough have been suggested since ancient times. One of the aphorisms of Hippocrates says that "sneezing after hiccough removes the hiccough." Mechanical methods of relieving a simple hiccough are regular forced breathing, by holding the breath, holding the tongue down with a tongue depressor, pressing the eyeballs, the external ear and the back of the neck, hanging from the arms stretched above the head, keeping the abdominal muscles tensed and holding the breath.

Many medicines have been recommended, but there is none that can be depended upon.
