Here is a picture of the present King when he was a boy and was known to his family and friends as Prince David. He is here dressed in a sailor suit, an early indication of his interest in the nayy.

This shows the new KING ED-WARD in the uniform of the Welsh Guards. He can in justice be called a warrior king, for he spent four years of his life, from 1914 to 1918, on many battlefronts. While in France for a time he was attached to the Canadian Corps and earned the Military Cross. Since the war he has been a leader in movements that were designed to benefit former soldiers and families of former soldiers. He has always been interested in farming. In Canada he was owner of a large ranch in the vicinity of Calgary, Alta. It had been expected that he would visit this ranch during the coming summer but his new duties as King probably will mean that this visit will not be made. In his farming activities he did much in the way of encouraging better breeding in farm animals and his herds were of the best grades obtainable.

Just before this picture was taken in Scotland Prince John was born. He died in 1919. The late King was deeply concerned with his family and his chief delight was to be with his wife and children. All the members of the family had democratic ideas and they were constantly visiting the homes of working people and offering what assistance they could in the solving of their problems.
