

Exiled Jews Find Land Of Promise In Isle Of Cyprus

Stop There on Way To Palestine and Decide To Stay.

The war correspondents bound for Africa who dropped off at the historic island of Cyprus to see if they could get a line on the whereabouts of the British Home Fleet found no warships, but plenty of other things not hitherto recorded.

Among them was the fact that many Jews on their way to the promised "homeland" of Palestine had also dropped off and, having dropped off, declined to proceed further. The correspondent of The Observer of London, who had landed at Fumaguata, decided to emulate their example—he would await the fleet, he cabled his paper.

After three months of silence he again cabled: "Still no sign of the fleet," and added, by way of extenuating his seeming indifference to the war in Ethiopia:

"The Jewish discovery of Cyprus has brought capital and brains into the island. Jews planted large areas of citrus, cultivated by improved methods. They introduced grapefruit. Near Limassol thousands of irrigated acres have been cut up into small groves of some two and a half acres, watered by a common well. Purchasers are sought for one or more units as soon as the trees are brought into bearing. A neat brochure sets forth the attractions of the scheme and works out profits to a decimal point.

Besides citrus, the Jews hope to produce 800 tons of tomatoes for export to the United Kingdom and Palestine. These early tomatoes are grafted on to potatoes, which lend them valuable qualities. Special cases have been ordered in Rumania for the export to England. The Jews also contemplate bacon and cement factories. A brewery is to be founded by Cypriot capital. But there is still no canning industry in Cyprus.

Among other developments are a telephone service and the improvement of electric light services, which an English syndicate is offering to take over. Money is being collected to build a \$45,000 consumptive sanatorium on the Troodes heights. A new residence for the Governor is nearly completed at a cost of \$215,000. The suggestion is made that more money should be spent on the eradication of trachoma, widespread among poor Cypriot children.

A recent law brought secondary education under government control. Hitherto the secondary schools have followed a Greek syllabus, and their masters are pensioned by the Greek Government. Their pupils proceed to Athens University.

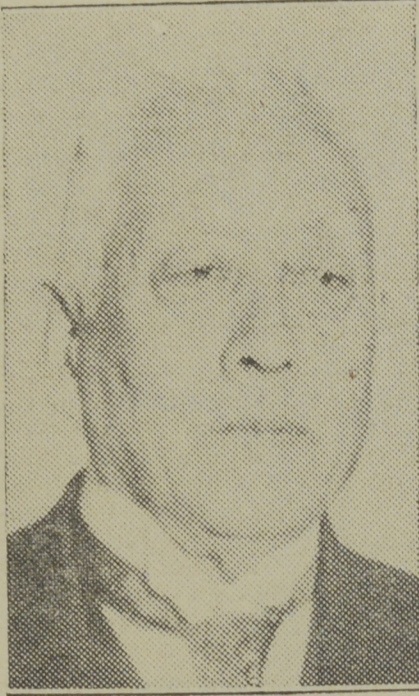
The police report a great reduction in crime. For the first nine months of 1935, as compared with the previous year, serious cases fell from 199 to 68 in a population of some 400,000 souls.

The chief wants of Cyprus remain to be cited. There is still no regular direct shipping communication with England. And the island is unable to negotiate directly with the many countries that export largely to Cyprus and buy little in return. To give only one example: Rumania, which should take oranges and raisins, sends exports to Cyprus to the value of \$1,000,000, but buys products to the value of only \$250,000.

Hot sulphur water gushes from the Cyprus mountains, and is even found in the sea at Davlos. So there seems no reason why a spa should not be developed.

Another vessel will bear the famous name, Mauretania this year—a small vessel of 345 tons running pleasure trips on the south coast of England. She is keeping the name until it is required for another big liner.

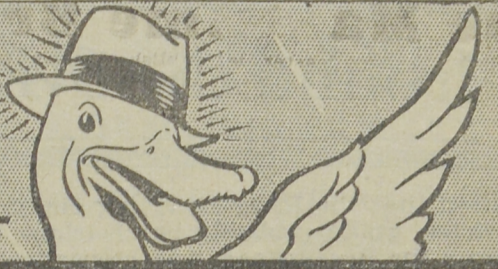

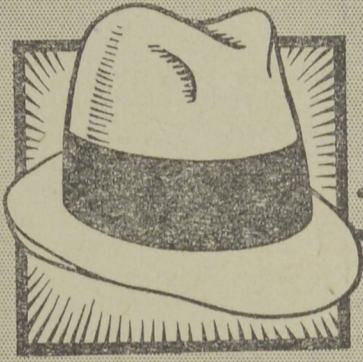

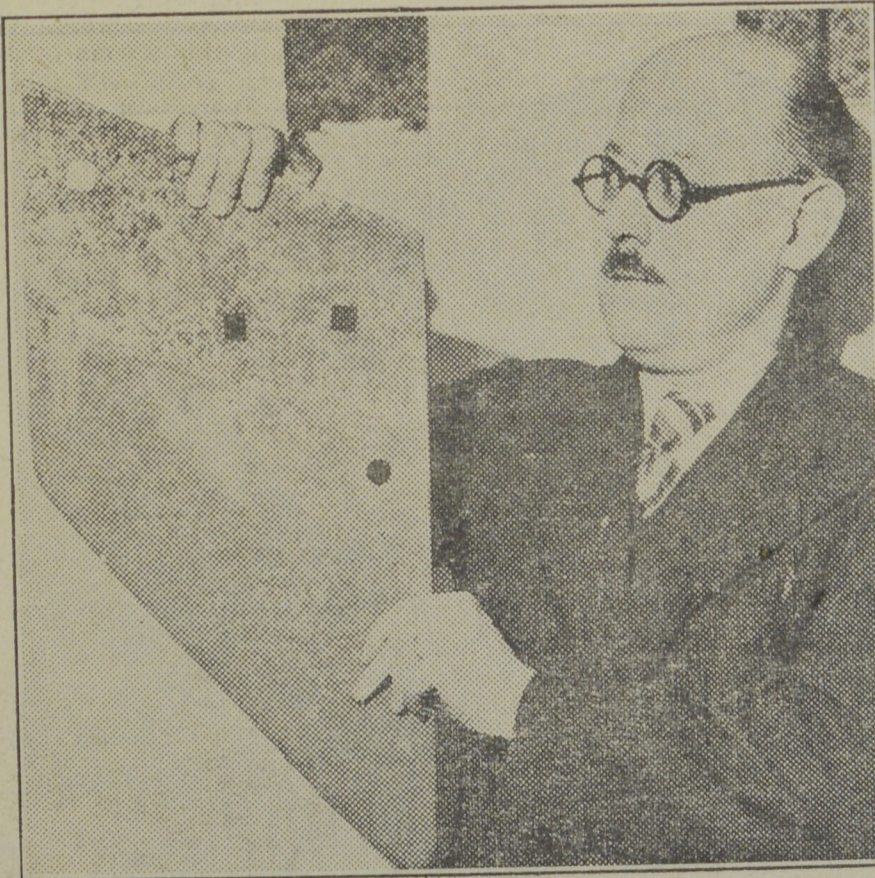

Our picture shows the knife of the guillotine which was erected on the Place de la Concorde in Paris during the revolution. It was bought in 1910 for 4,000 gold francs, but a much higher bid is expected at the forthcoming auction. According to authentic information this is the knife of the guillotine which was used to behead King Louis XVI, on the 21st of January, 1793. Nearly 2,800 people were guillotined in Paris during the revolution and this knife is almost as sharp now as at the time when it was in use.
