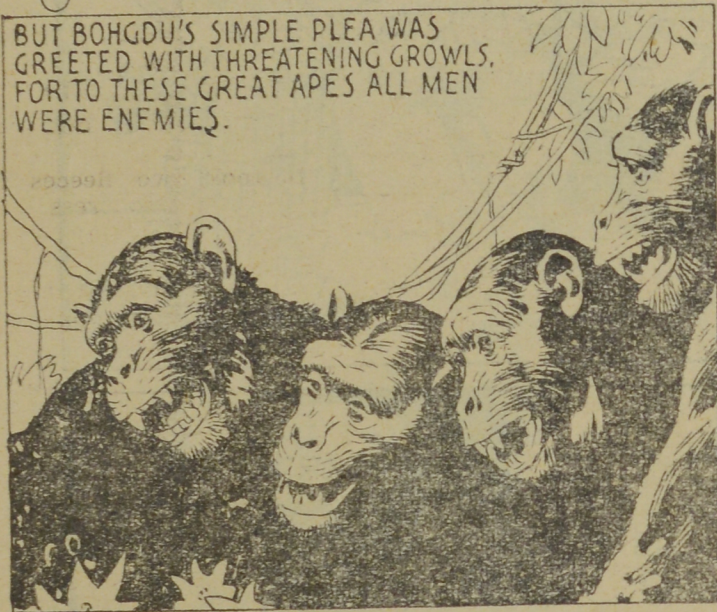
THE GIANT KING OF THE APES BARED HIS BRUTAL FANGS AND GROWLED ONCE MORE: "KON-GAH KILL."

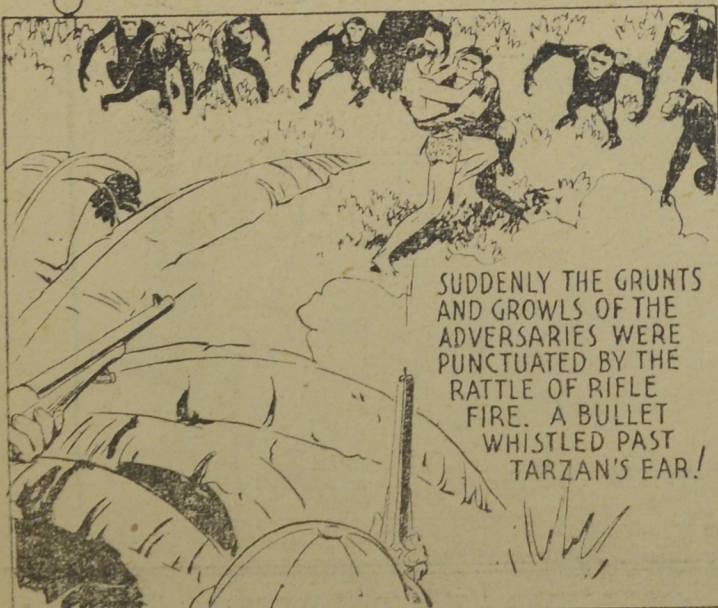
"TARZAN FEARS NOTHING!" HE CRIED, THEN THE APE AND APE-MAN PREPARED FOR FURIOUS COMBAT.
