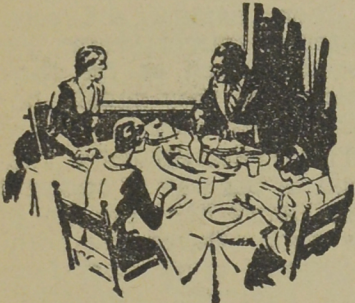

A GOOD PLACE TO EAT

What Happens To Duty-Free Liquor In New Brunswick

Federal and Provincial Laws Appear To Clash In This Matter.

There seems to be some sort of a clash between the Province of New Brunswick and the Dominion Parliament in the matter of alcoholic beverages. The man in the street is also concerned for he is the one who will have to bear the brunt of any unpleasantness which may arise.

Under the New Brunswick Liquor Act, no one in this province may have in his possession any liquor which has not been purchased from a New Brunswick Liquor Commission store. If a person transgresses this law he is liable to a fine of \$100.

But the Dominion Parliament says that a resident of any province may visit in the United States and bring back home an amount of alcoholic beverage not exceeding one quart.

Under the terms of the British North America Act the provinces continued to have control of the liquor business in their respective territories. So now the question arises as to what a person, who brings in a bottle of whiskey from the United States, will do with it when he gets it home. According to New Brunswick law, if he is caught with the bottle, he is liable to a fine, but the Federal law says he may bring in a bottle without paying duty.

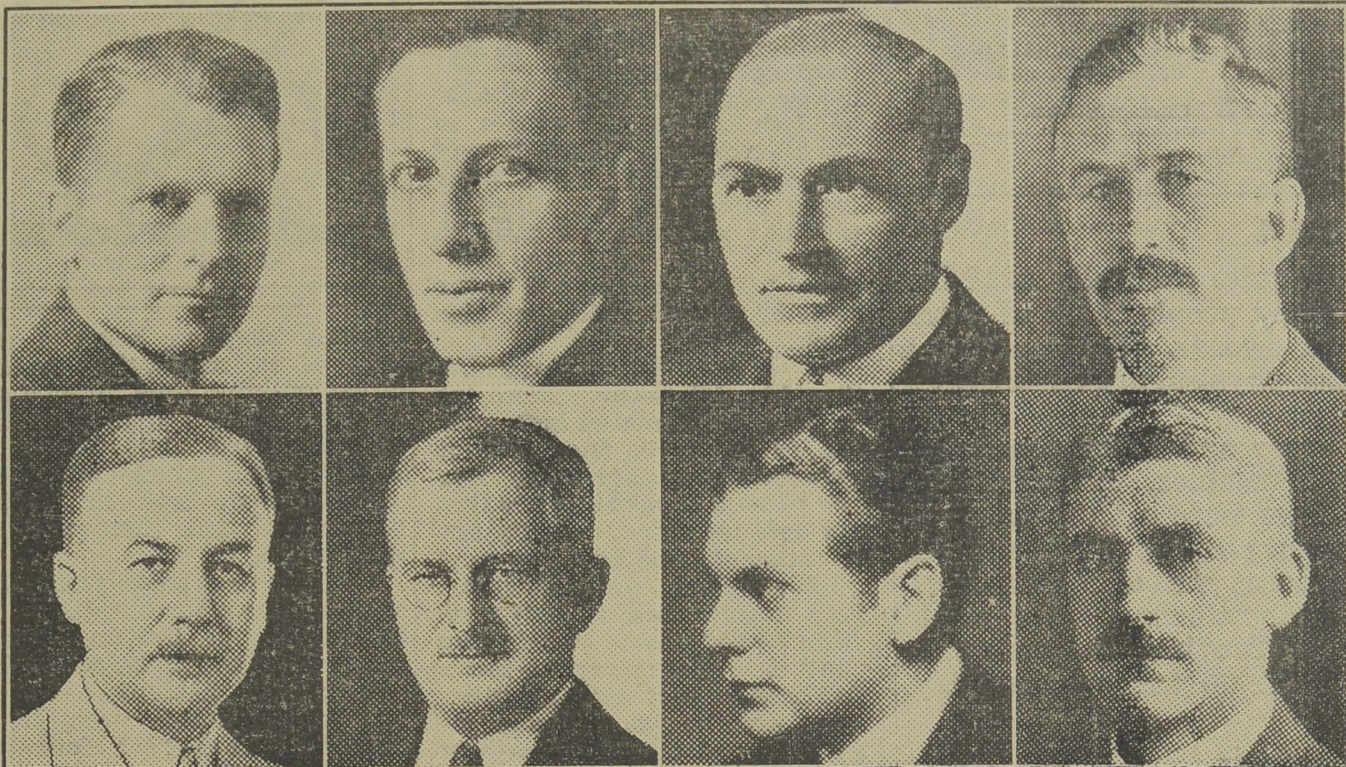

Relief Problems Remain Unsolved In All Provinces

Help To Be Provided by Governments For Another Month at Least.

The question of direct relief is still uncertain. There have been announcements that the Federal Government would discontinue contributions in May but now word from Ottawa indicates that the relief will be continued for another month or two.

The relief problem is a large one and no one community can hope to cope with it. There are some districts where relief is not being dispensed but almost everyone finds it necessary to curtail and economize.

Industry does not seem to be absorbing as many men as it might but those in business find it necessary to cut expenses in order to exist. In Saint John the unemployment relief load seems to be increasing and if all relief were cut off it is hard to tell what those who cannot get employment would do. People must be fed and clothed and provided with living quarters and that means that someone must pay, so relief will go on, probably for several years yet.

LESS COAL BANKED

The amount of coal banked this winter at Glace Bay is reported the lowest for many years. Early in April there were but slightly more than 79,900 tons in the screen bank at Sidney, compared with 213,000 tons a year ago. In the slack bank, there were less than 29,000, compared with 62,000 last year, or a total on both banks of 108,000 against 274,000 tons at this time last year.

Among the highest prices were £38 for a James VI. 40s piece of 1882 (a very rare coin); £25 10s. for a 1581 16s piece (not more than five of these are known), and the same sum for two Francis and Mary festoons (1561 and 1562).
