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THE VICISSITUDES OF LIFE.

LAW THAT IS NEEDED.

The vicissitudes of life in this country, in respect of business, social position, etc., will afford to the philosophic mind an interesting and not unprofitable subject for thought. To-day a man is comfortable or even wealthy, to-morrow he is of necessity a bread winner; to-day he is honored and influential, to-morrow his opinions are ignored and his intelligence despised, to-day he is fawned upon because of some superiority to the common herd, to-morrow there is none so poor as to do him reverence. This, probably, is somewhat peculiar to a new country, not because of difference in human nature the world over, but because in the older countries the regulations respecting the tenure of property are such, in many cases, as to prevent its removal from the family line by fraud or waste. The use of the property, and not the abuse, is often all that the occupant finds within the range of his possibilities, and hence his credit and his risks are more limited than would be possible in this country. The European idea would not suit in America, and is not, in fact, based upon the eternal fitness of things, but is essentially inconsistent with the fundamental principle of equality in property, as well as other rights and privileges that ought to be everywhere recognized as pertaining to all children born into the world. The rich man's boy and the poor man's boy should have equal equipments and then be left to fight on equal terms the battle of life. There was not a solitary condition to, or exception for, the rule which the good Lord laid down, as a partial remedy for Adam's disobedience, that in the sweat of his face man should eat bread all the days of his life.

Yet while the law should not do in this country what it does in England, in respect of the tenure of property, there is clearly something that ought to be done to secure justice to all concerned in case a man meets with misfortune through his own mismanagement or from the rascality of others, or by accident of any kind. To-day a man so situated may be pounced upon by a ravenous creditor, perhaps merely an act of brutality, or perhaps an act planned and plotted with others who have stolen the victim's property and, to shield themselves, desire his ruin; they may arrest him, waste his property in costs, and compel him, if desiring to deal fairly with all his creditors, to assign to some one, who may turn out to be in league with his despoilers and become their agent in completing the man's financial destruction, defrauding both him and his creditors. Such cases have been known, and are liable to be known again, the result being that the man is robbed, his creditors are robbed and somebody else, possibly some scamp, benefited by their misfortunes. The assignee may take special pains by short notice, by no notice at all, or by collusion with the rascals who created the embarrassment, to get the smallest possible price for whatever is to be sold, but the victims of all this wrong are without redress unless they can muster means to submit the proceeding to the review of a court of equity—a tedious process, probably, which for an indefinite period leaves the schemers in the enjoyment of property they have not earned and the rightful owner and his creditors out in the

cold. It will be said, of course, that not many men, having temporary control of creditors' and debtors' interests would be so unjust, so criminally dishonest, but while this is true, the exception sometimes exists, and therefore the law ought to make provision accordingly. It must be remembered that sometimes a perfectly solvent man may find it necessary, owing to unfortunate complications, or a general conspiracy to place his property where it will not be wasted but honestly used to give every one his due, and it does seem as if there should be provision made by law to secure this result. The old insolvent law of Canada may not have been perfect, but there surely should be some means provided by law that would secure the honest administration of an estate by a responsible man, one who by himself or bondsmen could be made to answer for mal-administration or dishonesty. Clearly parliament should be able to deal with this matter and, just as clearly ought every business man in the country to insist upon its being done.

BANK SUSPENDS PAYMENT.

BOUSQUET, THE CASHIER, IS THE CAUSE OF THE TROUBLE.

MONTREAL, July 15.—The Banque du Peuple, owing to difficulties with the cashier, Bousquet, who has impaired its confidence, suspended payment for 90 days. This is allowed by the Canadian banking act in which to adjust a bank's affairs, and if at the end of that period the bank is not prepared to proceed with business, liquidation would then be in order. President Grenier said tonight the bank hopes to resume at the expiration of 90 days.

When the news became known tonight a large number of the depositors surrounded the bank and there was considerable excitement, and a big run is expected tomorrow. The depositors will likely be paid in full, as the directors are personally responsible. The assets are placed at nine millions and the liabilities at seven millions. The bank has several branches in the province. The government inspector will hold an investigation.
