Yet while the law should not do in this country what it does in England, in respect of the tenure of property, there is clearly something that ought to be done to secure justice to all concerned in case a man meets with misfortune through his own mismanagement or from the rascality of others, or by accident of any kind. To-day a man so situated may be pounced upon by a ravenous creditor, perhaps merely an act of brutality, or perhaps an act planned and plotted with others who have stolen the victim's property and, to shield themselves, desire his ruin; they may arrest him, waste his property in costs, and compel him, if desiring to deal fairly with all his creditors, to assign to some one, who may turn out to be in league with his despoilers and become their agent in completing the man's financial destruction, defiauding both him and his creditors. Such cases have been known, and are liable to be known again, the result being that the man is robbed, his creditors are robbed and somebody else, possibly some scamp, benefitted by their misfortunes. 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
