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The New York Herald tells us that Lord Rosebery is reported to have said:—

There is one question that embraces all others which were before the late government, namely, the domination of the House of Lords. The existence of their power relegates the liberals to permanent impotence in the councils of the nation. On this question I am pledged to fight the coming election.

Precisely what ground Lord Rosebery proposes to take in fighting against the permanence of power in the Lords does not appear, but it would seem that he must take his choice of two policies—the destruction of the chamber or the curtailment of its powers. Either question will be an important one and an equally important one—to Canadians—must soon command the attention of Canadians. Is a Senate composed of nominees of the Crown, with life tenure of office, necessary or desirable in Canada? That such a body may interfere with and prevent the complete operation of the will of the people is evident and quite as evidently it may occasionally relieve a member of the lower branch whose constituents desire the passage of an act of which his conscience does not approve. He may vote for it below and scheme above to defeat the effect of his vote and thereby avoid responsibility for what he himself has done. The suggestion of this is a suggestion of low morality for practice of which no machinery of state ought to be provided. The senate too may occasionally prevent hasty and insufficiently considered legislation occasioned by more honorable causes than the one mentioned, but if we had only one chamber, would not the evils be prevented, and is not prevention better than cure?

We incline to believe that the time has fully come, whether Lord Rosebery means abolition or only improvement, that abolition is the true policy for Canada. Either that, or such reform as will give the people control of the constitution of the body, will inevitably soon be demanded by the people and a demand of that kind will not be successfully resisted by the Crown or its nominees. The people are intelligent enough to rule and must rule and ere very long they will sweep away every appearance of obstruction in the way of the clear apprehension of the fact that Canada is governed according to the well understood wishes of the people. Princes are excellent institutions, and we respect them, but men of intelligence should not need their aid in determining the rights, liberties, restrictions and duties which of right belong to all the people.

ABOUT INSURANCES.

A recent public meeting was called at Springhill to enter a strong and decided protest against the fire insurance companies perpetually increasing their premium rates in Springhill. The rates have been several times considerably increased; and the slightest pretext for an addition is seized upon. A committee was appointed to look into the whole matter and to make a report to another meeting.—Amherst News.

It would seem that Government should provide some means of preventing a combination of companies to advance rates unduly, as they are liable to do. We do not speak so feelingly on this point as we probably would if a few scamps had not reduced our premiums from some hundreds of dollars to next to nothing.

MARITAL ENTERPRISE.

A curious story is told of a divorce being granted after seven minutes spent in trial, and of the re-union of the parties in a new marriage a short time after. If this kind of thing progresses in the future as in the past the marriage knot will soon be a real bow-knot or beau-knot, that can be untied by mere volition, and therefore one that may be dispensed with. A knot that a little gale of wind will unfasten is of little value and may bedone without, and it will be in and early future unless there sooner comes an awakening to the great danger of utterly destroying one of the principal foundations stone on which social life is built. If it comes to be the fact that marriage ties are dissolved in seven minutes and renewed a few hours later, to be dissolved again perhaps in a few hours, what will be the ensuing condition of society? It might be well to think about it.

The revenue of Canada for the fiscal year just ended was \$33,119,485 and the expenditure \$31,228,872—showing a surplus of \$1,890,613. Some accounts not yet closed will change these figures somewhat. The expenditure, it is said, shows a reduction of a million dollars as compared with previous year. The debt decreased last month \$573,000. These figures are so gratifying we do not wonder that Hon. Mr. Foster has taken to bicycle riding.
