MANIFESTO OF THE CANADIAN REPUBLI-CAN COMMITTEE.

The following Manifesto of The Canadian Republican Committee of Toronto, is significant. especially on the eve of a general election, in that it shows a decided awakening of a certain section of the people in the direction of National Independence. FELLOW-CITIZENS -

The time has at length arrived that we are compelled to consider, and consider seriously, the position of our country.

We are to-day governed, not in the interests of ourselves the people of Canada, but in the interests of and by an oligarchy composed of corrupt and needy politicians and placehunters in Canada,

and usurers and bondholders in England We are, as you know only too well, eaten up by taxes, the great part of which go to maintain and strengthen the position of these parasites. It is estimated that every year Canada has to send out of the country to England not less than about thirty millions of dollars to pay the interest on government loans, mortgages, bonds, debentures, &c. This money comes out of the earnings of a hardworking and industrious people. We are in slayery to these politicians and usurers

This is due to the fact that we do not govern ourselves, although we are invited at certain intervals of time to come together to elect men to represent us in a parliament at Ottawa and in our provincial legislatures. We are governed in virtue of a constitution made and passed for us by and in the English parliament, It is not in our power to change this, no matter how much it may oppress us, with out the consent of this English paritament. We are therefore in colitical vassalage to England.

Further. An attemnat is about being made to draw Canada into a so called Imperial Federation, one of the first conditions of which will be that she will be called on to contribute towards the military and naval armaments of England. This means additional taxation; besides which it follows that we may also be called upon to furnish contingents of sailors and soldiers to fight in England's quarrels with other nations with whom it is our interest to be at peace; for the true in terest of Canada is friendship and commerce with the rest of the world.

England has by means of tiples, decorations, and in other ways bought over and corrupted numbers of our political men, members of the judicature, and many others to serve her purposes. These men are England's servants in Canada, and not the servants of the people of Canada.
