An old soldier named James Jones died at Sheffield recently. He enjoyed after long service a pension of eight pence per day—a little over a dollar a week. He had fought at the forcing of the Khyber Pass, at the relief of Jellalabad, in actions at Jugdulluch Pass, Tuz-en Valley, Khoord, Cabool Pass, Cabool, Moodkee, Ferozshah, Bobraon, Ramnuggar, Sudullapore, Chillianwallah and Googerat, and at Alma, Balaklava and Sebastapool.

For that service his country gave him eight pence per day to live on when he ceased to be of use.
