WHEN THE SMOKE HAS RISEN.

The smoke from the political battle-field in Canada has just risen, and we can see the havoc wrought by the opposing forces.

In this bloodless contest there are many dead, and crippled financially but no prisoners. The forces of the Government proved far the stronger, routing the Opposition forces horse, foot and artillery in Nova Scotia, British Columbia and the Territories, cutting down the Opposition majority in Ontario very perceptibly and maintaining an overwhelming majority in Quebec.

The disaffection in N. B. ostensibly over the G. T. P. deal lost the Government at least the constituencies of St. John and York, but they won Carleton and Northumberland and come out with a majority of one. In regard to York we were not surprised, as Mr. Crocket is a man of considerable ability and there were powerful influences at work in his favor notably the temperance and Orange

The G. T. P. deal was one that could not be justified on grounds of strict morality, but it was amusing to see the hypocrisy shown by the Tories in denouncing the scheme, when they engineered and carried through sometime ago a far more scandelous deal, giving a sufficient subsidy to build the road and sufficient land when sold at the rate it is being sold now, to pay as much more on capital stock, besides creating a monopoly, which has continued until this day, and which the Government for the first time is trying to break.
