All will be glad that the injury to our popular policeman Rideout did not result seriously. George is getting to be a general favorite as well as a master in his profession and we could ill spare him.

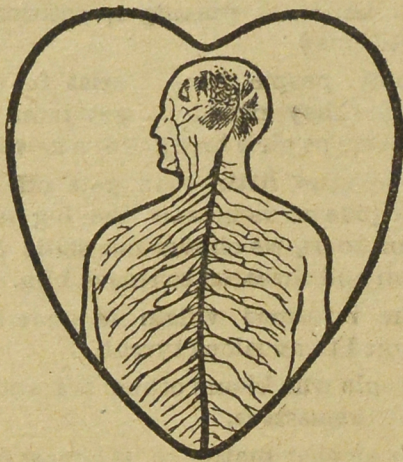
