Some years ago, shortly after Spooner started the Sussex Record, Train landed in that town and abode there a few months and with his strong sense of justice and passion for reform he was not long in finding out and denouncing in the withering terms which he could use so well, the inhuman and unchristian method which still obtains in most of our rural districts, of SELL-ING off the paupers to the lowest bidder, who generally half starved half clothed and overworked them and was seldom if ever called to account, as the hurried death of a pauper, while it made a little extra expense for burial. saved perhaps some years of keep, Train had money, and secured a column or so in The Record and for a while made some of the Pharisees wince under his scathing lash, until such opposition was raised that Spooner was forced to withdraw the concession if he would keep his paper running, whereupon Train started one of his own, but the people had influence enough with the Post Office Department to get it denied the privilege of transmission through the mails.

The matter then blew over, but the seed thus sown bore fruit in a few years in the splendid, clean, well conducted, humanitarian and nearly selfsupporting institution for the poor of the county.


