Township Thirty-Nine.

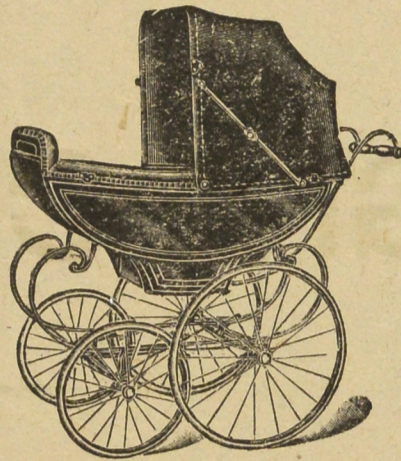
For, Yankee hearts are not all cold—
