SLIGHT SUGGESTIONS

President Cleveland protested
when Britain was about to crush
Venezula but Roosevelt did not
protest when Cecil Rhodes, Jo.
Chamberland and their band of ad-
ventures held their pistols at the
heads of the Transveal and Orange
Republics, but assisted them mat-
erially in getting remounts and sup-
plies. The German Kaiser, al-
though he did not care for justice
sent a cangratulatory message to
Kruger, and see the resentment
shown to it by the British press. If
he had really been a friend of free-
dom he could have prevented the
destruction of the South African Re-
publics. We would then be look-
ing upon him with reverence and
not as now with contempt. With

glish towns and murdering and un-

ren—England in return making
food stuffs contraband of war for
the purposing of starving out the
German population, and Germany
in return threatening to blow up
all neutral ships carrying food or
anything else to England, what we

warfare? An attempt was made at
Hague Conference to define honor-
able warfare, but what nation since
has observed it? The fact is that
war like religion sounds very well
in theory but is very rarely carried
into practice. As it is the strong
has no mercy for the weak, and
warring nations let no opportunity
pass if considered expedient, no
matter how cruel or dishonorable to
crush the enemy.
