The exhibition was not so large as on some former occasions, but most of the animals and produce were of the usual good quality seen in this fine district. Some excellent horses were on the ground, quite a number of Percherons colts, some of which give promise of being fine animals. Among the cattle were some fair Short Horns and Aryshires. We were disappointed in not seeing more of the former breed. This district is particularly adapted to raising Short Horns, and we are at a loss to account for so few being brought forward. Some good pigs and sheep were shown, but the number was small. The roots were large as might be looked for on such soil. Some fine samples of wheat were shown, grown from seed imported by the Government last spring. One sample by Mr. G. A. Sterling, yielded 30 bushels from three-quarters of an acre. This fact should induce the more general raising

of this grain. We have not obtained a copy of the prize list, but hope to do so soon, when we will


