TO THE ELECTORS OF THE County of York. GENTLEMEN:— In a short time you will be called upon to elect some person to sit in the House of Commons. I have had the honor of holding for ten years, and I have been somewhat successful during that period, I have had the honor of being elected at the same time, and I have been successful in the discharge of my public duty. It has been my aim to do the best for the welfare of the whole Province, and I have endeavored to be supported by the interests of all in view, and to support such measures as would be for the benefit of our local improvement. Our interests are varied, and to legislate and bring the whole into harmony is to my mind a problem yet to be solved. The building of Railroads and Canals, giving us an internal communication for the Commerce of the country, will help its solution; but it will take time and money to work it out successfully. When we look at the vastness of our territory, extending from the Atlantic to the Pacific Ocean, and the millions of acres of Prairie land, resting or waiting for man to cultivate and bring into use, we pause with wonder what to do! We dare not falter, we must go forward. Years must roll around before we can reach our reward. Our debt must vastly increase until our population is increased to ten millions or more. Perhaps then our revenues will increase faster than our expenditures, without increasing our taxes, or thinking of our Territory yearly, giving disaffected politicians an opportunity to make capital out of the changes. During the last five years we have been waiting deep in a commercial crisis, almost without a pause, and not only we, but all the nations of the world. There has been no depression on every hand; a want of confidence in everything that attempts to reach us. Let us start like anew, with William Lams and hearts, strong to brave the storm to come. We have given up our every man; let them grumble; it will be less work to carry them along with us, than to try to make them understand. We have other more needy than our own, and we have more to do after the leaves and the fishes, and the Wedge of gold, and the world will soon roll over them and hide them from our view. I thank you, Gentlemen, for your confidence in the past; I have your confidence in the future; and I hope that your confidence in dealing with the trust that you place in my hands for years ago, has been such as to justify the belief that I have not placed in my hands a desire to advance your interests. I re-echoed I shall endeavor, aided by ten years experience, to do all that I can to promote your general welfare. If on the contrary you decide to elect some one else, I can only say that you will be wiser than your decision without a protest. I will not wish you in aiding your representative to fill the responsible position in such a way that will tend to divide and weaken the unity of the Dominion in the eyes of the world, without attempting to lower by word or deed any of our people, but I will not give up special interest to see you all, if possible, before the election, in your districts.
