She was advertised to sail from Quebec on her return trip on Saturday, June 1st, with the Liverpool mails calling at Lough Foyle to receive on board and land mails and passengers to and from Ireland and Scotland.

LONDONDERRY, May 10 .- Many of those injured by the explosion on the Bardmian are not expected to recover. The vessel is on fire admidships; half the wrtch are in the forecastle, and a number of steerage dassengers in the fore part of the vessel, and are cut from help.
