U. S. ELECTION.—This week has been one of great political excitement in the United States. Congressional elections have been held in three-fourths of the States of the Union, gubernational election in some of municipal elections in the City of York. The result shows that in the Eastern and some of the Western States, the Republican party has gained some seats, but the gains of the Democratic party in the Southren States have more than counterbalanced Miss Dora H. In the city of New York the Tammany Ring candidate for Mayor, Schell, has been defeated by Cooper the Anti-Tammany combination party candidate.




