A LAW In amendment of Law relating to Public GEO. F. GREGOBY Wharves, Landings, Mayor. and Anchorages.

Be it enacted by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Fredericton as The owner or person having charge of any raft of logs, deals, or other lumber, or raft loaded with any articles or any raft of any description shall, when the same shall arrive at any public wharf or landing within the City, pay the sum of seventy cents to the Wharfinger and Harbour Master; and if any such raft shall remain at any such public wharyes or landings for a longer period than twenty four hours at anyone time, the owner or person having charge thereof, shall pay to the said Wharfinger or Harbor Master, the sum of forty cents for every day (sundays excepted), such raft shall remain over the said twenty-four hours; and if any such owner or person having charge shall neglect or refuse to pay any such sum on demand by the Wharfinger and Harbor Master, he shall for every such refusal, or for every day he shall so neglect to pay, be liable to a penalty of one dollar.

A LAW In addition to and in (COPY.) ammendment of the GEO. F. GREGORY, SEVERAL Laws relating Mayor. to the Fire Department Be it enacted by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Fredericton as

1. There shall hereafter be established in the City of Fredericton, under the control of the Fire Department of the said City, one Hook, Ladder, and Axa Company, and also one Fire Protection Company, each of said Companies to consist of not more than fourteen men; but such company and smay, however, by Bye-Law of the Company admit such number of unpaid or supernumerary members as may be deemed advisable. The Captains and men of the said Companies shall be paid for their services each year by the respective Captains, who shall receive from the City Council the sum of sixty do lars, on or about the first day of May annually, for such purpose, to be divided by the said respective Captains in proportion to the services rendered by the several members.

2. The Captains of the said Companies shall be appointed by the City Council, and shall be responsible to the City Council, and shall be responsible to the City Council in the same way and to the same extent as Captains of Engine Companies are now responsible by law.

3. It shall be the duty of the officers and men of the Hook, Ladder and Axe Company to attend promptly at all fires with their apparatus, and there to aid by the erection of their ladders and by means of their other apparatus in the extinguishing of fires, and for that purpose in the removal of buildings and other inflammable material if necessary.

4. The Fire Protection Company shall assist in the provisions of property from buildings, in the provision of property so removed and in maintain-rection of the Chief Engineer in preventing peace and good order at fires, and under the direction of the Chief Engineer in preventing access by the public generality to property exposed, and to prevent plundering by all means in their power.

5. The said Companies as herein constituted stall, except as hereby provided, have the same Rules, Bye-Laws and Regulations a other Fire companies.

6. All property owners or tenants are hereby required before the first day of June in each year, to remove or cause to be remov

carried out, as soon as possible after the passage

thereof.
7. "A Law in amendment of a Law to regulate the Five Department," passed January 2nd, 1878, and so made of any and all other laws regulating or relating to the Fire Department as are inconsistent with this Law be and the same are hereby Passed and enacted this 7th day of May.
