While every Dutch boer in Natal is growing rich by preying on the necessities of the British Government in the matter of transportation facilities. Imperial soldiers are compelled to undergo privation and danger for a mere pittance. It is true that officers in high rank generally obtain suitable rewards in acknowledgement of gallant services per-formed, but the brave rank and file are too often forgotten or ignored. As it was in the days of Wellington, so it is to-day. The defence at Rorke's Drift recalled the deeds of the British army in its most glorious bays. Yet this is the fashion in which the gallant defenders have been recognised by a so-called grateful country:—" In consideration of the gallantry displayed by non-commissioned officers and men at Rorke's Drift, the issue has been sanctioned of a flannel shirt and a pair of trousers to each man present, to compair of trousers to each man present, to compensate for damage to clothing." The generosity displayed by the British Government in providing covering for a soldier's legs is simply tounding.—Toronto Mail.
