Gleanings of Interest for Our Country

Grow more turnips. Lime is an insecticide. Tar the sheep's noses. Keep your eistern clean. Fertile land is never idle.

Get your fruit ladder ready. Put lime where sorrel grows. Browse is not fat-producing. Use common sense in feeding. Red blood is warmer than blue.

Be careful in using insecticides. The best always find ready sale. A good planner saves hard work. A fast is often better than a feast. The featility of a bare soil burns up.
