Washington Negotiations.

In his Montreal speech the Premier said:

"I must leave commercial questions to my colleagues, and especially to my friend, Mr. Fielding, the minister of finance. But I may be permitted a word about the negotiations now proceeding at Washington. It has long been my opinion that our relations with our neighbors were not as cordial as they ought to be. I am a patriot; at least, I believe I am. I love my country more than anything else, but I never believed that in order to be a patriot

to love one country, it was necessary to hate other countries.

"I love my country, but I do not conceal the fact that I have a great admiration for our neighbors, who are a very great people. I love my country. I love the Mother Country whose subjects we are, and the ancient fatherland which gave us life. I love also our American neighbours and hold them one of the greatest nations of the earth. I do not see why two nations like ours and theirs should not be inclined to render justice on both sides.

We are at Washington to settle the difficulties we have had, and we hope to settle them, to use an English phrase, 'by giving and taking.' Nothing can be done without mutual concessions, but I assure you that if I come back from Washington with a treaty, I shall have sacrificed none of the interests or of the dignity of my country.
