We lately paid a visit of inspection to the store of C. A. Phillips and Son, at

nce of business enterprise and tact,
resents itself to visitors. The whole
ug from basement to roof, is now
to the exigencies of the rapidly
growing business; the partners residing
at a distance from the business premises
—perhaps we ought not to mention this
during the burglary season—this very
fine business building is a commodious,
and well appointed store, such as we (in
simple ideas) hardly expected to find, so
far away from a city or large town.

The basement which we first inspected is a large, roomy well lighted warehouse which contains a large heating apparatus that not only keeps this portion of the premises at a comfortable temperature, but also serves to heat the whole of the superstructure; it is a most elaborately constructed affair, with many branches of bright tinned-iron pipes, starting from it, to convey the hot air to the various aparments overhead. We presume these pipes are used in obedience to the pre-

Pails and other goods, that occupy too much space to allow of their being kept in the retail part of the establishment. The stock of goods kept here somewhat surprised us, and we expressed an opinion that it was very large, for a country store, but, were assured that it was not an abnormally large stock, when the constant demand was taken into account.

On ascending to the upper floors over the shop, we found it divided into compartments for the different branches of business. In one of these we noticed an extensive display of Ready made Clothing, full suits as well as single garments, in endless varieties of material, make and fashion. In one apartment is shown a large quantity of Rubber Goods, while another contains an extensive display of

pretty articles rancy Unina Go. of Bijouterie, another room was used to show a fine exhibit of Fancy Goods, in the shape of Albums, Photo Frames, a large collection of Toys for thejuveniles and all sorts of unique articles suited for Christmas presents, all scattered around in the most admirable confusion. In fact the whole establishment is one of which any provincial town might well be proud; it's usefulness will be further augmented, on the first of the coming New year by the addition of a First class Tailoring department; under the immediate superintendence of a first rate, experienced, Cutter and Fitter.
