The Comparative Value of Foods,

The following table showing the comparative value of the foods usually fed to farm stock, may be found of some interest to farmers, as indicating relatively the amount that is necessary to substitute of each, to replace a proper ration of good hay. The quantity set down to each substance shows the amount that it contains of nutritive material equivalent to 100 pounds of good hay.

BEAUFORT.

This comparatively isolated and out-of-the-way settlement, was first opened up in the year 1877. It was surveyed with a view to settlement by Messrs. Hartley, and Garden; but did not seem to attract settlers until the late Mr. Wm. Beaufort Mills, induced a number of artisans from St. John, to come and locate themselves on the land. Mr. Mills having been permitted by the government to name the settlement after his own collateral christian name. The tract of land surveyed was set apart by the government as a "Free Grant" settlement; that is the right and title to the land was given, without any cost of conveyancing; or any purchase money, simply by fulfilling certain settlement duties, which are not onerous, and are all, for the settlers individual benefit. The Crown title is absolute and without a shadow of doubt, or equivocation. We well remember reading, some years ago a very glowing description of the settlement, and have still a lively recollection of our disenchantment; after a weary tramp of twenty miles, through snow and slush; to find the land of milk and honey, buried beneath five feet of pretty solid snow. No matter that time has gone by and we have a better opinion to-day; of the settlement, and it's capabilities, than our first introduction gave a promise of. The land in this settlement is good and tolerably free from stone, it is also pretty level and abundantly supplied with water. The Shikitehauk river runs through the western part of the settlement, and the south branch of the Miramichi skirts it on the south, while several fine streams traverse it in various directions. All of these streams abound with Trout and furnish excellent sport.

Although so far from any great road or line of communication, Beaufort has, in the past few years, been going ahead, a perceptible change has taken place in the character of the buildings, log buildings are fast disappearing and more imposing structures are being erected. As a mark of social and intellectual progress, the versatile correspondent of one of our esteemed contemporaries has become the Godparent of the settlement, and given high-sounding names to many of the residences. This is all very good in time and place, but it seems a little too early in the life of a backwoods settlement, to indulge in such luxuries; cheap as they are. Nevertheless; Go on! and prosper, We hope yet to see the day, when the Iron Horse will run screaming through it's vales; and to hear the Sabbath bells pealing from an English Church tower, calling the faithful to return thanks; "For thy best blessings, Oh, Heavenly Giver; Home with enough, and an Englishman's church"
