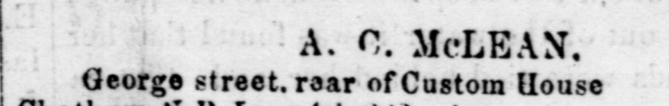

NOTICE is hereby given that the Government will offer for sale by Public Auction, at the Dominion Lands Office, Winnipeg, beginning on MONDAY the 19th day of September next, at 10 o'clock, a. m., the following lands, namely:-

- 1. The lands in certain parishes on the Red and Assiniboine Rivers, then remaining undisposed of. The upset price to be \$5 per acre.
2. The lands then remaining the property of the Government in the Menominee Reservation, situated in townships 1, 2 and 3, ranges 1 to 5 west, both inclusive, and in township 1, range 1 east in the Province of Manitoba, at the upset price of \$3 per acre.
3. Certain School Lands in Manitoba situated in the best settled portions of the Province, at the upset price of \$5 per acre.

TERMS OF PAYMENT.

For the river lots and the lands in the Menominee Reservation, one-half in cash at the time of the sale, and the remainder in two years in equal annual instalments. For School Lands, one-fifth in cash at the time of sale, and the remainder in nine years in equal annual instalments. 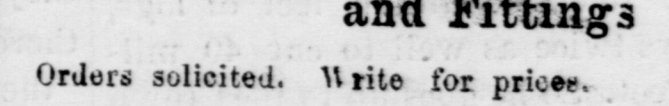
