

Not less than 2,000 Albanians had responded to the call. As we took up our places on the carpets which had been spread for the Pasha's party under the shadowing branches of an olive grove, which fringed two sides of the meadow, the whole assemblage rose to their feet and saluted their leader with a long, low shout.
