LORD, LEO XIII, BY DIVINE PROVIDENCE, POPE, PROCLAIMING AN EXTRAORDI-NARY JUBILEE.

At both Masses in the pro-CathedralSunday last, His Lordship, Bishop Rodgers, announced depraved men. that he had received the official copy of the Encyclical letter from Our Holy Father, proclaiming a universal jubilee. His Lordshlp then published the conditions for gaining the indulgence of the jubilee which are, To fast one day which is otherwise not a fast of obligation.

The Holy Father had in the Encyclical recommended one of three objects to which the alms might be given, namely, towards the Institution for the Propagation of the Faith, the Societies of the Sacred Infant Jesus, and the Schools of the East. But in this Diocese the amount obtained in the way of alms would be divided, one half going to the Funds for the Propagation of the Faith, the other half for the support of the Holy Father, who in the administration of his sacred office was under heavy expenses.
