SEALED TENDERS, addressed to the Postmaster General, will be received at Ottawa until noon, on FRIDAY, 1st April, for the conveyance of Her Majesty's Mails, on a proposed Contract for four years, 24 times per week each way, between Newcastle Post Office and Railway Station, from the 1st July next. The conveyance to be made in a suitable vehicle drawn by one or more horses, subject to the approval of the Postmaster General.

The Mails to leave Newcastle Post Office four times per day in time to connect at the Railway Station with Day and Night Mail Trains going both north and south. Returning to the Post Office immediately after the arrival of each train.
