A GEOLOGICAL PRISON CELL. An Instance of Nature Coming to the Assistance of the Law. "Speaking of caves," remarked the drummer whose territory extends from New York to everywhere, "I suppose you don't know that down yonder in the cave section of southwestern Kentucky it isn't unusual for the towns which are built over caves to use them as sewers, and there's many a kitchen with its sink leading right down into the depths of the earth. But an even odder use than this to which nature may be put I discovered in the cave country of Virginia.

The little town of Eldradge, with a population of 600 or 700, has a large contingent of miners to be handled by the authorities, and when they got ugly they are ugly indeed. Two or three 'coolers' for their accommodation when drunk and disorderly had been burned or torn down by them, and the town marshal was hard put to know what to do. At last the editor of the local paper suggested that the cave in the mountain not 300 yards from the city hall would be just the thing for a calaboose, and the marshal proceeded to investigate. He found that the way then in use to get into it was down a ladder 30 feet through an entrance 6 or 8 feet in diameter, and that when once in the cave the air was dry and good; there was a stream of fine water and that, though it was dark, the electric light could be introduced easily from the town plant.

"That was his report, and without saying anything much to anybody beds and boards and a few other pieces of necessary furniture were taken down, and on Saturday night when the boys began to whop it up and were taken in they were carefully let down into the cave by a rope on a portable windlass that had been rigged over the mouth and silence prevailed on the face of the earth. The lights were turned on and it was bright and cheerful; the boys had all the room they wanted; they could do as they pleased (down there), and the loudest noise they could make couldn't possibly be heard on earth. That plan worked with eminent success until one night there was a light and a man was hurt, and then the authorities fixed up some cages, or pens, and an officer went down first to receive the visitors and care for them on their arrival. It has been working that way ever since and is undoubtedly the safest prison in the whole country and is the cheapest and most enduring."—Washington Star.

The Buck Saw. "The buck saw in any mind," said the middle aged man, "is indelibly associated with a saw buck—the reach between the two X's half saved through, where it had been scored by the saw dropping down upon it—standing by a wood pile in the back yard. There are scraps scattered around on the ground and chips of bark and more or less sawdust. "What brings all this to my mind is the sight of a man sawing wood with a buck saw on the deck of a schooner lying at a South street wharf, a stick of cord wood resting in the saw buck, and the man with his knee on it and sawing away just as he would ashore. At first this looked strange, and so it does still to some extent. I had seen saw bucks and the deck saws on the decks of canalboats, where they looked natural enough, because the canalboat is usually close by the land, where one could step to or from it easily, but I could scarcely make the buck saw seem familiar on a salt water craft, because it seemed to me so essentially a thing of the land. "Finally I did make it seem all right on the schooner, though, by thinking of that as a vessel making short voyages and keeping near land and hauling up maybe in creeks close by the shore and as being in various ways intimately associated with the land, but I couldn't think of it as being used at sea. But when I came to think it over I knew, of course, they must have some way of sawing wood aboard deep water ships, and when I came to inquire I learned that the buck saw is used afloat just as it is ashore; it is piled on a ship a thousand miles at sea just as it would be on a farm."—New York Sun.

The Irish Difficulty. I believe that the full development of agricultural organization points the only way by which the agricultural industry in Ireland can be saved. The principle upon which under modern conditions the salvation of Ireland must be sought becomes more manifest every year. The Irish difficulty has long been rather economic than political, and it is more than ever today. Solve the economic problem, and in the process the Irish people will be so elevated and strengthened that they will be able to solve the political problem for themselves. I am firmly convinced that all future attempts to deal with the Irish question on purely political lines are doomed to share the fate of Irish policies in the past.—Right Hon. Horace Plunkett, M. P., President Irish Agricultural Organization Society, in North American Review.

Spanish Peasants' Trick. In one respect the Spanish peasants are ahead of the rest of the world—they have learned to make cocks hatch eggs and look after the chickens, while the hen, being at liberty, can and does lay more eggs than she would if hampered by her maternal duties. The trick is performed in this way: They carefully pluck the feathers off the rooster's underparts, and the bare skin is then irritated with nettles until inflammation sets in.
