vention priceeds as follows:-"It is here-
by by agreed and declared bet ween the un-
dersigned, duly authrizized, that the word Soudan in this agreement means all
territuries south of the 22 ad parallel of
latitude, which have never been evacu latitude, which have never been evacu-
ated by the E.yptian troops since 1882
or, which, having been adminitred by nf, which, having been administrated by
the Kiedive's Guvernment prior to the
lite rebellion, were temporarily lost to Egypt and have heen reconquered by the
Britsh and Egytian governuents acting in concert, or which may herenfter be neting in concert.
"The Britith and Egy,tian flags shall
be used together on both land and water be used together on buth land and water
throughout the Soudan, except in Sua-
 conven only hy Khedival
The neat Britain."
The next elanse gives the governur-
general absolute power to make, alter or
brogat nbrogate by proclamation laws, orders or
regulations for the good government ot the Soudan and for the regulation, hold-
ing, dispusal and demolition of property
of every kind situated in the Soudan, that of every kind situnted in the Soudan, thut
all such proclanations must forthwith be given notice of to the agent of Her Brit
aunnic Majesty
dant of the Kario, and to the presi-
 ply tway part of the Soudan, save
the proclanation of the governor-gen
eral. eral.

reside or hond propert in the Soudn,
the convention says: "No special privileges shall be accorded the sabjects of any
one or more p.wers. Import duties shall one or more prowers. Import duties shai
not he levied on \&ouds from Egyptaiu
tervitery, but they shall be leviable on grods from elsewhbre. In the case of
goods entering from the Soudan at Suar-
kina, ar any other Red Sea put able upon foreign tyoods entering Egypt.
Duties may be levied upon goods leavind
Dhe Soudan, the the Soudan, the rates to be prescribed by
proclanation. The convention prorides that the juris-
