

#### FATTENING EARLY.

This Plan's Advantages Considered and Pointed Out.

In nearly all cases it will pay to push the growth of all of the pigs now, so as to be able to fatten them early. After cool weather sets in in the fall is rather the most favorable time to secure a rapid gain at a low cost. With care to keep the stock in good, thrifty condition now, it will be much easier to fatten rapidiy. The principal advantage in this is that it affords a better opportunity of taking advantage of the market. To a very considerable extent the cost of production is the same and any difference in the price means


that much difference in the plofits. So far as can be done conveniently, it is best to give hogs the range of a good pasture. Even in winter this will be better than to confine them closely, as they will pick up more or less of a variety of food, and the exercise they will take is always beneficial. At the same time it will be good economy to provide dry, comfortable quarters for them to quarters and to insure being dry it is inside is five or six inches higher that the outside. CAMPING OUT IN WINTER. A. CHIPMAN SMITH. STRUAN ROBERTSON The Rare Pleasure of Tening in the Ice and Show The early morning of Thursday, the last day of January, was clear and still. The heavy snowstorm of the day before had ceased during the night, leaving a new layer, a foot in depth, upon that which already lay deep over mountain and lake, and piling itself No. 1 City Market Building, Charlotte St. high upon every branch and twig of the dense forest about us, writes C. Grant La Farge, in the Atlantic. I had awakened at 3, still conscious of the effects of yesterday's long tramp of eight hours following fresh caribou tracks through heavy timber and in deep, soft snow, only to find that the waning day bade us strike out for camp for the further route of our game was still to be disentangled from a labyrinth of tracks, made where they had stopped to feed. We had eaten our lunch as we marched, delay being Soaps, Erushes Combs, Etc., Etc. a thing to avoid and fire out of the question on so fresh a trail, and when we reached camp again, just as darkness closed in, we were a tired and Maritime Provinces hungry pair.
