

NEW YORK, July 19.—A fire destroyed more than a quarter of a million dollars worth of property on the Brooklyn water front to-night. Although the attitude of Labouchere and Dillon is hardly patriotic, the Gov. ernment policy is obviously to make the movement of troops as public as possible. since the only hope of averting war depends on convincing the Boer's of the Government's serious intentions.

Mr. Chamberlain stated that the estimate of the Uitlanders in the Transvaal today is 200,000. Of these, judging from the proportion in 1894, 159,000 are British subjects. In the gold fields English is theoretically allowed as a medium in instructing the children of Uitlanders, but more Dutch is being used daily, until practical Dutch is becoming the only me-The Uitlanders were forced to dium. subscribe \$100,000 to get an English education in the schools for children. 
