

The sixteenth annual session of the grand lodge of I. O. G. T., for New Brunswick opened at St. Martins at 2 o'clock, on the 14th inst. Some 150 delegates were present, representing nearly all the counties of the province. The visitors were met at the station by members of Sea Shore Lodge, and preceded by the members, marched to the hall.

From the W G C T's report the following extracts are made: There have been instituted during the year 79 new Lodges; initiated 5,051 new members, making a present membership of 6,000.

The report of the secretary showed that \$2,000 had been paid in and 1,900 paid out, and that six lodges were building new halls.

Rev Dr Bill, at the evening session, gave an eloquent and feeling address, welcoming the members of the grand lodge to St Martins and to Sea Shore lodge.

Rev Thomas Marshal, grand Chaplain, made a fitting and stirring reply on behalf of the grand lodge.

Resolved that the session of the lodge next year be held in St Andrews on the second Wednesday in July.

The meeting of the grand lodge was the most largely attended ever held in the province, the meetings being packed. The visitors were enthusiastic in praises of the natural scenery and the hearty hospitality of the people of St. Martins.

In the evening a large and enthusiastic temperance mass meeting was held in the Baptist church. Prayer was offered by the Rev I E Bill, and the following gentlemen delivered addresses: Rev Dr Bill, Rev J S Allen, Rev Wm Picton, Rev Wm Povit, Messrs W McNeil, J R Woodland and G A Belyea.

TEMPERANCE NOTES.

On Tuesday evening next a public temperance meeting will be held at Millidgeville, under the auspices of Almon Lodge, I O G T.

This evening Valley Division S of T, hold a strawberry festival in their hall.

On Thursday evening next Gurney Division, S of T, will receive a fraternal visit from their brethren of Hampton.

Last Sunday afternoon a number of prominent Good Templars paid a visit to Carter's point, to hold a public gospel temperance meeting there, under the auspices of Olive Branch Lodge. The meeting was called for three o'clock, and the temperance hall was packed to its utmost capacity. A. P. Wilson presided. Prayer was offered by Mr. G. W. Barker, of the Lewis street Mission Home, Boston, and the chairman read a passage of scripture. Mr. John Mehan was the first speaker, who vividly portrayed the baneful effects of alcohol on the human system. He dwelt at considerable length on the success attending the meeting under the order of Good Templars, and closed his address with an earnest appeal to all not already members to connect themselves with some temperance organization, if not with Olive Branch Lodge.

Mr. G. W. Parker followed. Mr. Parker handled the subject of temperance in a manner that held the closest attention of the audience. He gave a description of the haunts and slums of society in and around Boston, to which the assembly listened earnestly; Mr. John Law followed, describing scenes from personal observation, the evil

of intemperance, and the blessings attained through leading thorough temperance lives. Mr. Calvin Powers said the order of Good Templars was founded on the Word of God. He spoke at some length congratulating the audience on the widespread temperance sentiment of the people of Westfield.

Mr. W. H. Wood and Captain Waters, each said a few words of cheer and encouragement of the good work being done in the district, and the latter gentleman moved a vote of thanks to the St. John gentleman for holding the gospel meetings, which was unanimously carried by the entire audience arising to their feet.

The first gospel temperance meeting held at Carter's point, closed with Mr. Wilson delivering one of his earnest and well-timed speeches. The Carter point homestead and Miss F. Carter were unceasing in their exertions to make the visitors happy, and after tea a vote of thanks was tendered Mrs. Carter and daughter for hospitalities received.

The musical entertainment and strawberry festival at Valley division hall, Tuesday evening was fairly attended. The ladies' committee of the division were untiring in their efforts to make every one happy. Mr. John McQuarrie presided. Mrs. McMasters opened the entertainment with selections on the piano, after which refreshments were partaken of, the patrons being seated at tables provided for the occasion. The stage was tastefully decorated with evergreens and flags, and a most noticeable feature of the entertainment was Rebecca at the Well, the part of which was very creditably taken by Miss Lizzie Baxter, who dispensed lemonade to the thirsty ones present. The Strawberry Festival Thursday evening in the Market building, under the auspices of Victoria Temple of Honor was very well attended considering the many attractions elsewhere. Refreshments in abundance were supplied to the audience, and instrumental and vocal music, with recitations and speeches by prominent temperance men, included the principal part of the exercise. Mr James Gillis presided and Mr. D Mc Nally disposed of the strawberries remaining by auction. The exercises concluded with singing the national anthem.

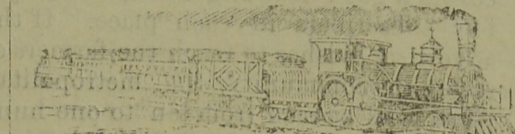
