The Temiscouta

All sorts of rumors are afloat respecting the new Short Line to the port of Halifax as projected by the Grand Trunk Railway Co. This movement is evidently made just now to make capital out of the claim of the Harvey-Salisbury route. The latter rcute may be looked upon as settled as the Government is in a position to order its construction in view of the satisfactory survey made the present season. Last week the G. T. R. kings held an interview with the Government at Ottawa, and the C. P. R. Magnates also met the Government. This line of railway, if granted Government aid, would be a strong competitor of Canadian Pacific Railway for ocean bound freight. It was announced some time ago that the Grand Trunk people had determined to secure the shortest possible air line on Canadian territory to Halifax. It is understood with this object in view they secured an option on the Temiscouata Railway and are now having surveyed a route from the terminus of the latter road as direct to Moncton N. B. as possible. Mr. Davey, engineer-in-chief of the Temiscouata Railway Company, and Mr. Cranston, C. E., are now engaged in locating the line between Edmundston and a point on the Intercolonial near Moncton or Salisbury, N. B., the direct distance between the two places being 160 miles, but 12 order to secure the traffic of an important section of the country a slight deviation from an air line will be made, increasing the distance thirty miles, or 190 miles in all. This would make the distance from Montreal to Halifax in the neighborhood of 753 miles, or about 100 miles shorter than by the present route over the Intercolonial and Grand Trunk.
