

An Indian Pow Wow.

The usual Sabbath serenity was sadly disturbed last Sunday by a general drunken row among the Indians on the St. Mary's reserve. Shortly after one o'clock a messenger was despatched for Commissioner Farrell, and in a short time a big crowd was following Sergt. Vandine, detective Roberts and the night policemen to the bridge enroute to the battle field. When the officers were in sight of the camps there was a general skedaddle, and two of the Indians escaped to the adjoining woods. It was but a short time until four Indians were secured, and as they declined to leave home and squaws peaceably the handcuffs were produced. As these articles were scarce one Indian was tied to the bridge while others were prepared for marching order. In an hour

the officers had eight red men behind the bars in the lockup. Monday was 'Indian G W P, Denton C Thomas, Palmyra day' in the police court and police magisaccommodate one-half of the spectators GWP, HF Smart, Concord, NH. who attempted to effect an entrance in the underground court.

They all pleaded guilty to the charge of drunkenness and four of them at once confessed that they received the firewater from George Nash, the white husband of a squaw. These were fined \$5 and \$2 costs, which amount was paid by a woodboat captain who wanted the Indians to finish loading his vessel. The others were liberated. Nash pleaded guilty to giving them the rum but refused to give the name of the party who supplied it. He was fined \$50 or two months gaol and of course went to gaol.
