G. W. P.'S REPORT.

To the officers and members of the Grand Division, S. of T. of North Carolina:

Six months have passed since our annual session, and we have assembled to report what of success or failure has attended our efforts, in the meantime. As the head of the Order, in this State, I regret to report so little done on my own part. I am always ready, anxious, and willing to do what I can for the cause of Temperance and our noble Order, but have had too much to do. Since our annual session, we have had in our midst the M. W. P. of the National Division, on an official tour of inspection. He was delighted with our country and pleased with our people; but deplored the lethargy of some to provide anything for the Cause of Temperance, and a united effort for its advancement.

While here he visited Ashville Division, No. 15, stopped at Pigeon River, revived Waynesville Division, No. 18, visited Pigeon Valley Division, No. 30, and lectured at Ashville and Clyde. He is very zealous and earnest in his work, and I hope his visit among us has done us all good. A District Division in the county of Haywood, was also organized, by Bro. Temple, and I had hoped to organize one for Buncombe by this time, but stress of weather and other circumstances, have prevented; it will however be organized soon. A new Division has been organized, or rather an old Division has been revived, at Lyman, Carter Co. known as Jarret Bay Division, No. 164. There is a deed on record in said court to said Division, for house and lot, which I am informed is good property, whether the Division can obtain possession of it I cannot say, but an effort is being made in that direction. I will lend all the aid I can to procure it. The subject of an organizer has been long discussed, but nothing has been done in that direction. I believe the spring and summer would be a good time to begin propagation work, if a suitable man can be had he ought to be sent to new fields and our District Divisions do all the propagating work in their jurisdiction. I hope to be able to do more work during the next six months and ask the hearty co-operation of all to push our Glorious Order into every County and Hamlet in the State.
