Tobacco Poisoning.

The New York Medical Journal, in an article upon the injurious effects of tobacco upon the health and physical development, says:

"In an experimental observation of thirty-eight boys of all classes of society and of average health, who had been using tobacco for periods ranging from two months to two years, twenty-seven showed severe injury to the constitution and insufficient growth; thirty-two showed the existence of regularity of the heart's action, disordered stomachs, cough, and a craving for alcohol; thirteen had intermittency of the pulse, and one had consumption. After they had abandoned the use of tobacco, within six months onehalf were free from all their former symptoms, and the remainder had recovered by the end of the year.
