GOOD EYESIGHT.

So indifferent do many of us become to the common blessings of life that exellent eyesight, perhaps, may not be alled always a source of happiness, but is certainly true that the loss of eyesight is a source of unhappiness. 1. Avoid reading and study by poor light.

2. Light should come from the side, and not from the back or from the

3. Do not read or study while suffering great bodily fatigue or during recovery from illness.

4. Do not read while lying down. 5. Do not use the eyes too long at a time for near work, but give them an ccasional period of rest.

6. Reading and study should be done systematically. 7. During study avoid the stooping

position, or whatever tends to produce congestion of the head or face. 8. Select well-printed books.

9. Correct errors of refraction with proper glasses. 10. Avoid bad hygienic conditions and

12. Let the physical keep pace with the mental culture, for defective eyesight s most usually observed in those who are lacking in physical development.
