

Some Facts about the Scott Act.

It would appear that those who are in favor of open rum-shops in the city of Fredericton, have succeeded in getting sufficient names to a petition that under the law, they may again test public sentiment for or against the repeal of the Scott Act. In view of the probability that the petition may result in a vote, it would be well for the citizens to quietly think over the facts as they are regarding the rum traffic and the promoters of this repeal movement.

1st. The Scott Act has been law in this city for about 12 years and during that time, notwithstanding a small increase in population, in the city proper, and a large increase in the suburbs, such as in Gibson, Marysville etc., the number of arrests for drunkenness has been very much less than in the years before the adoption of the Act.

In these years the children have been growing up comparatively safe from the temptation of the corner rum-shop, and have been educated to the fact that rum-selling is an evil and a crime, and have learned to look on the sellers of liquor as violators of the law of the country and as criminals.
