I have seen a man come to a doctor and say, 'I want a certificate.' The doctor wrote it out asking how much he wanted. 'A pint was the reply, throwing down ten cents. The doctor swept it into the till and thought he had earned it honestly. Perhaps he did, but I doubt it. On the other hand a vendor can hang up a certificate in his bar with 3, 4, 5, or as many bottles marked in it as the applicant chooses, and if the vender is inclined to be a rogue, he can give liquor to that individual just as often as he likes and marks them when he pleases. If he is hauled up for it he will swear that that man has a certificate on file and that he has only gotten one or two bottles on it, suppose he got fifty, unless you can prove to the contrary. We have found this out this summer, to be a fact.

For high license we'll give to a few men all the privilege of running off with \$50,000 of the Newark Bank, of watering the stock, in a railroad company, taking \$250,000 at one clip. Now I shall have this license very high, say \$10,000 for theft, and in that way

we shall put an end to all these sneak thieves and tuppenny scoundrels and wharf rats, and all hail to the million dollar rascals. You will never put down theft in this country until you give a few people for a high license all the privilege of stealing.

Then there is THE EVIL OF BLASPHEMY. Now, we have got to stop these clumsy assassins who kill people with car-hooks, and Paris-Green, and dull knives, and having a high license, say \$10,000 or \$20,000 give to a few men the privilege of genteely and

SKILFULLY AND GRACEFULLY putting their victims out of their worldly misfortunes. You will never stop murder in this country until you put a high license upon it, and let a few men do all the killing. But my friends, all irony aside, you see that if rum selling is right we all ought to have the right; and if it is wrong, five million dollars paid down in hard cash for one license ought to produce no immunity. -Talmage

**Juvenile Drunkenness in Austria.**

We still sometimes have retailed to us the old absurdity about the sobriety of continental Europe, where there is a good deal of drinking of light wines and beer. Unfortunately the evidence will not sustain the sobriety doctrine. The British Medical Journal, of Nov. 17th last, said:—"The temperance of Austrian women has long been proverbial; but, if the accounts recently published respecting the intemperance of boys and girls in that country are reliable, we fear that Austria will not long continue to sustain its former good character for feminine sobriety. So serious and widespread has inebriety been of recent years among school children that the Vienna School Board have, though hitherto ineffectually, been making strenuous efforts for the prohibition of the sale of intoxicating drinks to children. The board has just resolved to invoke the intervention of the Government, and a bill is to be laid before Parliament during the present session to prohibit the selling of intoxicants to boys and girls under 15 years of age. So alarming is the present state of matters that the appearance of a boy at school in a state of drunkenness is by no means a rare sight.

During the winter poor children are often sent to school with only a glass of the cheapest spirits for breakfast, partly to allay hunger and partly to 'keep out the cold'—that venerable delusion which still lingers in England. Slave children of the tender age of five and six are so "seasoned" to alcohol from infancy by the administration of small quantities in milk that these youthful scholars can take a liberal dram without showing any symptoms of intoxication."

**The Maine Law.**

Gov. Marble has appointed Dr. J. O. H. Burnham, a practicing physician of Buxton, to be special constable for the enforcement of the liquor law in York county.

Julia Martin of Winthrop, who was arrested by officers from the U. S. Marshal's office, Saturday last, for alleged violation of the United States revenue laws, was arraigned before Commissioner Bradley in this city Monday morning and was bound over to the February term of the U. S. Court. In default of bail she was committed to Portland jail.

Fate of Gardiner rumsellers: J D. White, druggist, pleaded guilty to an indictment of maintaining a liquor nuisance and was fined \$150 which he paid. George H. Winslow,

saloon keeper, pleaded guilty to being a common seller and was fined \$100, paid. Benj. Riley did not appear when called and his bonds were forfeited. Peter A. Houliban, an old offender, and prominent saloon keeper did not put in an appearance, and his bonds were forfeited. He was heard to say that he had weak lungs and that there were too many tramps in Kennebec jail, that the air would be bad there this winter, and that he was going to Florida. -Portland Herald.

A hearing was had before the Senate Committee on the Sunday-Rest Bill, at the time of the Sabbath Convention in Washington. Petitions bearing six million names had already been received, and, pasted on red cloth, formed the unique decorations of the Foundry Church, in which the Convention and the hearing before the Senate Committee were held.

George Downs, of Troy, N. Y., in a drunken rage, shot and killed James Logan, his dearest friend, for no reason whatever, except his friend upbraided him for intoxication.
