

The Annual Session of Welland District Division, Sons of Temperance, was held at Port Robinson on the 17th inst. This was one of the best sessions ever held even by this the "banner" District Division. There were about 120 representatives present, notwithstanding the very busy season amongst the farmers. Bro R Coulter, G W A, and D W P, of Welland District Division, occupied the chair. A pleasing and encouraging feature of the session was the fact that a large number of the representatives were those who had been "Sons" for from 25 to 40 years, and have not yet grown tired of the work of the Order. Bros Edward Carswell, P M W A; R J Conover, G W P, of W N Y; Jas Brooks, P G W A; and W H Bewell, Grand Scribe; being present were introduced to the District Division by Dist Con, T W Atwood, and received a hearty welcome.

The reports of officers, committees and the deputies were very encouraging and indicate a healthy progressive state of the Order in Welland County. Practical plans were laid for future work, work that will be performed.

Bro Coulter has been a member of the Grand Division since 1852, and the D W P of the District Division since its organization several years ago. It is generally conceded that his untiring energy and devotion to the Order, and his great executive ability has very much to do with the continued healthy state of the Order in Welland Co. For some years he has been anxious to have a younger member take his place as D W P, but when nominations for that office were asked for, only Bro Coulter's name was presented. He urged to be relieved but it was useless. Old and young urged him to continue, and finally the representatives rose in a body to promise him all possible aid, in the work if he would but continue as D W P. Our good brother gracefully consented and accepted this thoroughly unanimous nomination. The election of officers resulted as follows:

Hearty votes of thanks were given to the visiting members for their presence and addresses, words of counsel and cheer to the members of Port Robinson Division for the excellent provision made for the entertainment and comfort of delegates and visitors, and to the members of the District Division who furnished the literary and musical programme.

In the evening a mass meeting was held in Coulter's hall, which was packed. The D W P, after opening the meeting and requesting Bro Booth another veteran in the work to lead in prayer requested the Grand Scribe to preside. The earnest addresses of Bros Carswell and Brooks were heartily applauded, as were also the excellent musical selections rendered by Bro Gilchriese and Sisters Gilchriese and Wells. The District Division was a great success in every respect and reflects great credit upon our noble brethren and sisters, old and young in the banner county of Welland.

Bro T W Atwood, Pro D G W P; writes that between Oct 1st '88 and Oct 1st '89, he attended 49 sessions of his own Division; wrote 23 letters on "Good of the Order;" wrote the press 24 times; visited fourteen Subordinate Divisions and also the Grand Division of W N Y; attended all the sessions of Welland District Division and G D session of Ontario; addressed 11 public meetings; travelled over 400 miles on behalf of the Order and hopes to do better next year.

Albert Division, No 31, held a public meeting on the 21st ult. A splendid programme was provided and the Grand Scribe gave an address on the origin, principles, objects and utility of the Order.

Excelsior, Ontario and Toronto Divisions, recently gave a series of public meetings in Toronto. Bro Edward Carswell, P M W A; was engaged for the occasion. Two meetings were held, on the 13th inst in the Temperance Hall; on the 14th, the meeting was held in Woodgreen Church; on the 15th, in Euclid Avenue Church and on the 16th in Cooke's Church. It is confidently expected that good results will follow and our city members deserve credit for the efforts thus made to extend the Order.

Report of Grand Scribe, Vermont.

Officers and Members:—One year has swiftly passed away since we last met in Annual Session and our Grand Division has had its ups and downs. Five new Divisions have been instituted, four (4) of these were instituted by T M Lewis, agent, supplied us from National Division and one Division by Bro. McClellan of Greensboro two of the number organized by Bro. Lewis failed to mature. The G D has also been obliged to suspend from its roll Springfield Division which has made no report for three years. I have not carried its membership for one year but carried the Division as a Division on my National report last year, thus you see we have to-day 9 Divisions in good standing. Your Committee on propagation worked hard and faithfully to extend the Order in the State, but at the time when they took the work in hand it was in the Presidential Campaign and of course you all can see the one great reason for our non-success. Some considerable money and time were spent in the work. Brother Spring, G W P, Chairman of Propagation Committee will make a financial report of that work. Since our last meeting I have made two official visits one to Putney Division and one to Vergennes Division, and found them in excellent working order. My report to-day will not be long but I would recommend that members of Divisions go into towns adjoining them and try and work up and organize new Divisions, thinking this can be done better that by an agent who would be under a regular salary, and thus the expense would be saved to the Grand Division. There is another matter I wish to bring before you for consideration, that the Grand Division have a Journal of its proceedings and standing printed this year, and sincerely hope that this Grand body at this Session will instruct the Grand Scribe to compile and have published such a Journal, and thus not be behind all other Grand Divisions in this respect. The cost will be small, and the results large. I would most respectfully recommend that the Grand Division vote to pay the Grand Scribe "hereafter as long as the funds will permit" the sum of \$25 per year for his services and I assure you if he does his duty he will doubly earn that amount, this is the only Grand Division but what pays the Grand Scribe a salary. With the standing of this Grand Division at the present time the income will be over \$100 per year, and this you see can be readily done without any danger of becoming bankrupt. Again let me urge the members of Subordinate Divisions to bring the Order before the people by using your local papers, furnish them items of interest pertaining to your Division, and the Order at large. I would suggest that you use in bringing the attention of the public to our Order the columns of the Temperance Journal, "printed by Bro. H. H. Pitts, Past G W A of New Brunswick" and that as many of the members as can afford to do so, will subscribe for the same. It is printed in the interest of the Order, and is virtually the organ of the Sons of Temperance of North America. Furnish its columns with items of interest concerning your Division, and the Order. Every week read it, then pass it to your neighbors, let them read it outside of the Order, and they after reading it from week to week and noting what you are doing, will knock at your Division door and ask for admittance. I would recommend that all Division

Deputies act as agents and correspondents. Secure subscribers, then furnish items for the paper thus you will largely increase the membership in our Grand Division. Star of Hope Division of Vergennes, organized last spring, has by their effort to bring their Division before the public, gained popularity and public sentiment in their favor, and donations in money from friends of the Order has begun to come in to the treasury. I have frequently read in the Burlington Free Press articles complimenting them for their good work. I doubt not but this Grand Division will be invited to hold its 43rd Annual Session with Star of Hope Division in 1890, when you will be tempted to partake largely of their hospitality.

The Grand Division was represented at the National Division at Saratoga Springs, June 26 and 27 by our Grand Scribe, G W A and P G W A, Bro. Kibby. Your Grand Scribe presented a petition for a new charter, ours having been destroyed by fire at Woodstock, and as soon as the original charter members names can be looked up the same will be issued.
