Mowatt, and between the ten minute talks the favorite Crusaders and Aid. Estey's choir kept the audience in good humor.

Mr. H. C. Creed was the first speaker and made some capital points in favor of the Scott Act.

Mr. Fred. J. Todd explained what he had suffered by rum and regretted that he had voted against the Scott Act last election, but so earnest was he in his present advocacy that he would rather lose his arm than that the Act should be defeated.

Mr. Nat. J. Smith just carried the audience by storm, and his ice cutting flanger took like hot cakes and he left it right on the Bench bevel.

Mr. Pitts followed with an analysis of the vinegar and molasses phases of argument used in connection with rum sellers and he favored the former in the discussion of the Scott Act. He showed why every rum drinker should vote for the Act.

Mr. W. H. Anderson was greeted with applause as he pronounced himself strongly in favor of the Scott Act. He is now a strong advocate of temperance principles and is sure to do much good among his associates.

Rev. Dr. McLeod was called from the audience and warmly complimented the speakers upon their success. It was the most enjoyable meeting he had attended, and after making some practical remarks on the question of the hour, the meeting adjourned.
