THIS NEGRO IS 120 YEARS OLD.

Helped Build Court House in 1808, and Last Week Helped on New One.

COLUMBIA, Tenn., Oct. 25.—In this city resides probably the oldest person, whose age is known by record, in the United States.

He is Richard Porter, colored, born in Virginia in 1778, as attested by records in that state.

In 1808 the first court house ever built in the county was erected, and this same Richard Porter helped to lay the cornerstone and to erect the building.

A sister of Porter recently died at the age of 100. His mother lived to be 90. His grandfather was a full-blood Indian.

He is able to get around remarkably well, considering his advanced age, although his sight and hearing are defective.
