CANADIAN RECIPROCITY.

New York Commercial To Prevent the Loss of Vigorously Urges a Treaty.

(New York Commercial.)

A very effective argument for the negotiation of a new trade treaty with Canada, which is urged by its advocates, is the success that has attended the treaty that we negotiated with Cuba. During the first nine months that this treaty has been in operation the value of our exports to Cuba of agricultural implements, printed matter, flour, vehicles, cotton cloths, machinery, locomotives and several other products has either nearly or more than doubled.

If such a result has attended trade reciprocity with Cuba, far greater, in all probability, would be the advantage that this country would gain from a judiciously arranged treaty with Canada. NEW YORK'S STRUGGLE.

Trade to Baltimore, Boston and Other ports.
